Improve How We Assess Learning: Teachers will work together to ensure that their assessment of student work is consistent across different subjects.	You can be part of our parent focus groups that look at Learning & Teaching, helping to shape how we approach student learning.

Expand Student Leadership Roles: We will increase the number of official leadership awards

of official leadership awards available to students from their first year right up to S6.

Encourage your child to take on leadership opportunities, whether it's in a club, a class project, or a formal programme like the John Muir Award. Celebrate their initiative and growing confidence.

Aim for Rights Respecting Schools Gold Award: We are working towards the top award for putting the rights of young people at the heart of our school. Your feedback and involvement help provide the evidence we need to show that we are respecting and promoting the rights of every child at Bearsden Academy.

Priority 3: Supporting Student Wellbeing and Progress

We want to ensure every student feels supported and is making good progress. We are improving the way we track both academic achievement and personal wellbeing, allowing us to provide the right support at the right time.

Improve Tracking and Support: We will use school data more effectively to identify students who may need extra help and provide targeted support.	We will keep you informed about your child's progress. Teachers will use more data points to help plan effective interventions.
Focus on Attendance: We will be reviewing our attendance procedures to ensure we can work together effectively to support students who are often late or absent.	We hope to make information sharing around latecoming and attendance easy and useful for parents.

Develop a "Plurilingual Hub": We are creating a dedicated space and more resources to support students who speak multiple languages or are learning English.

If this applies to your family, encourage your child to use the hub and take advantage of the support available. This will help them gain qualifications that recognise their language skills.

Involve Parents in Reviewing Our Progress: We will use our parent focus groups to help us check how we are doing and plan our next steps.
